

Heritage Horse Shows

GENERAL INFORMATION-RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Proof of current negative EIA /Coggins Test must be available upon request.
2. All riders must wear an SEI/ASTM approved helmet while mounted.
3. HHS, its employees, directors, and members will not be responsible for any loss, expense, injury to person or property, or death to any person or horse that may arise out of or in connection with HHS.
4. All entries and members agree to abide by the rules of HHS as a condition of entry. Show management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, and to cancel any entry, disqualify exhibitors, and cancel awards or prizes without claims for damages.
5. **DISORDERLY & UNSPORTSMAN LIKE CONDUCT WILL NOT BE TOLERATED.**
6. All pets must be on a leash and in hand while on show grounds. HHS reserves the right to impose a \$25.00 fine on any owner whose pet creates a safety hazard or affects order of the show.
7. All exhibitors must be in good standing prior to start of the first class in their division.
8. A \$25.00 charge will be applied for any returned check or for any show bill not settled by end of show. An exhibitor with an outstanding bill from a prior show will not be given a number or stall until arrears are paid. Points for any exhibitor will not accumulate until all bills are current.
9. Points will not accumulate unless exhibitor is a Heritage member.
10. Pre-paid fees will be granted for any entries mailed with payment by Friday, one week prior to show.
11. All entries will be charged a \$15.00 schooling fee and a \$15.00 administration fee with the exception of Leadline which will only be charged a \$15.00 administration fee. All non-showing horses must obtain a back number to school. HHS reserves the right to require back numbers to school. Schooling will be allowed in rings on Friday from 12:00 pm to 7:00 pm on Friday and from 6:30 until 30 minutes before the first class begins on show mornings. HHS may extend or shorten schooling times at its discretion.
12. Heritage Horse Shows will incorporate USEF rules as applicable.
13. Riders, trainers, parents, and friends shall not use profanity in the ring or at the ring or anywhere deemed inappropriate.
14. It is the member's responsibility to know the rules, complete all forms, and keep track of their points and class placings. All judges' cards and results will be kept for the entire circuit and may be requested by the trainer of record to be reviewed. Any questions or appeals must be presented in writing. Points will be posted on the web site as a courtesy only. All appeals must be made at show based on printed points.
15. All competition disputes will be resolved by management which will serve as stewards. Decisions by management or judges will be final. Any protest must be made in writing at show office and must be accompanied by \$50.00 which will be refunded only if decision is overturned.
16. Riders and horses may enter and cross enter into any class which they qualify as outlined in class offerings.
17. If a rider elects to advance to a new division, they may do so and take two show days (highest total) of points with them and forfeit all others. When advancing, the rider may elect to retain any points earned in lower division but will not carry any points into new division. Note: for the purpose of this rule a "show" will be defined as one day. Penalty for improper cross entry will result in loss of points for show.
18. The judge's decision is final and smiles are mandatory.
19. BACK NUMBERS WILL NOT BE ISSUED WITHOUT A CHECK ON FILE OR ENTRY PAID IN FULL.
20. Riders and trainers must demonstrate caution in the schooling ring and must observe ring etiquette. Apply safe schooling rules whenever possible.
21. A rider's age will be based on the age of the rider as of September 1st of the current show year.
22. Coaching from the rail is prohibited. A rider's score can be negatively affected by improper assistance or rule violation.

ADDS AND SCRATCHES Add/scratch must be completed in office prior to the start of division. Add/scratch after start of division will be charged a \$5.00 fee. Show scratches will be billed \$20.00.

CLASSICS AND ADDBACKS

Monies paid out varies by number of entries. Please see class list for payouts. Rider must meet qualifications of division to enter in classics or addbacks offered at a specific height. Specifications and eligibility will vary for special classics (i.e. night classes, etc.).

Entries 10 or more: 1st: 10, 2nd: 7, 3rd: 6, 4th: 5, 5th: 4, 6th: 3, 7th: 2, 8th: 1

Champion: 3; Reserve Champion: 1 (in all divisions)

CLASS OFFERINGS

Hunter and Equitation Divisions

LEADLINE

Limited to exhibitors 7 and under. To be shown at walk, walk/trot and walk command. Year-end points will be kept for the rider (not horse/rider combination). **May not** cross enter into any other classes.

WALK-TROT

10 & Under

To be shown at the walk and trot in both directions. Walk class will be shown at the walk only. Hunter class will be judged on manners and suitability of mount. Equitation to be judged on rider. In jump class, exhibitors will be asked to jump across rail at 12" and may be asked to stop or back after the jump. To be shown by riders 10 and under in their first or second year of showing at any organized show. Year-end points will be kept for the rider (not horse/rider combination). **May not** cross enter into any other classes.

OPEN WALK-TROT

11 & over

To be shown at the walk and trot in both directions. Walk class to be shown at the walk only. Hunter class will be judged on manners and suitability of mount. Equitation to be judged on rider. In jump class, exhibitors will be asked to jump a cross rail at 12" and may be asked to stop or back after the jump. Year-end points will be kept for the rider (not horse/rider combination). Open to exhibitors in their first or second year of showing at an organized show. **May not** cross enter into any other classes.

BEGINNING CROSSRAIL

13 & under

Open to riders 13 and under who have not shown over a course prior to the show year (one previous year of beginning crossrail permitted). Consisting of walk/trot hunter under saddle class, walk/trot/canter equitation flat, and two O/F classes over four baby cross rails and an O/F mini medal consisting of 4-6 cross rails. Rider may trot or canter fences. Hunter class will be judged on manners and suitability of mount. Simple changes allowed. Year-end points will be kept for the rider (not horse/rider combination). **May not** cross enter into any other division including jumper divisions.

JUNIORS/ADULT BEGINNING CROSSRAIL

14 & over

Open to riders 14 and over who have not shown over a course prior to the show year (one previous year of beginning crossrail or junior/adult beginning crossrail permitted).. Consisting of walk/trot hunter under saddle class, walk/trot/canter equitation flat, and two O/F classes over four baby cross rails and an O/F mini medal consisting of 4-6 cross rails. Rider may trot or canter fences. Hunter class will be judged on manners and suitability of mount. Simple changes allowed. Year-end points will be kept for the rider (not horse/rider combination). **May not** cross enter into any other division including jumper divisions.

CROSSRAIL HUNTER AND EQUITATION

15 & under

To be shown by riders 15 and under who have not shown over a course of 12" prior to the show year. Over fence classes will include up to eight fences in a course consisting of 12" cross rails. Rider may trot or canter. Simple changes permitted. Hunter classes will be judged on suitability and manners with equitation classes judged on the rider. Additional testing may apply in the medal class. (USEF Tests 1-8.) Riders will be asked to canter in U/S and Flat. Year-end points will be kept for the rider (not horse/rider combination). **May not** cross enter into any other classes **except** tadpole jumpers, warm-ups, pony pleasure, or pleasure (excluding hunter hack).

OPEN BEGINNING HUNTER

Open to riders who are in their first or second year showing over fences. Course of up to eight jumps will be set at 12" crossrails and then the same classes will be run at 18" with gates and rails with each judged together. Riders may trot or canter, and simple changes are allowed. Hunter classes will be judged on suitability and manners with equitation classes judged on the rider. Additional testing may apply in the medal class. (USEF Tests 1-8.) Year-end points will be kept for the rider (not horse/rider combination). **May not** cross enter into any other classes except tadpole jumpers OR froggy jumpers, warm-ups, pony pleasure or pleasure (excluding hunter hack).

GREEN HORSE/PONY HUNTER:

Division open to horses/ponies in their first two years of showing over fences. Advanced riders and professionals allowed. Over fence classes may be jumped at 12" crossrails or verticals at 18". Simple changes allowed. **Horse/pony may not** cross enter into other classes except warm ups, schooling hunter, pleasure and pony pleasure. If **rider** meets other division requirements, **may** show in Open Beginning Crossrail, Crossrail Hunter and Equitation, Short Stirrup, Equitation 14 and Under or Main Hunter ring classes. Overall points will go toward Overall Hunter Horse and Overall Hunter Rider category.

SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER AND EQUITATION

15 & under

To be shown by riders 15 and under who have not shown more than two years over fences at 18". Over fence classes to be shown over a simple course of up to eight fences at 18". Simple changes allowed. U/S and flat classes to be shown at a walk, trot and canter in both directions. Additional testing may apply in the medal class. (USEF Tests 1-8.) Year-end points will be kept for the rider (not horse/rider combination). May not cross enter into any other classes except warm-ups, green horse/pony, pleasure, tadpole jumpers and froggy jumpers.

EQUITATION 14 AND UNDER:

14 & under

To be shown by riders 14 years or younger. Riders may not be showing in any other equitation division over 2' at the same show. Over fence classes to consist of courses of 9 or less jumps. Classes including flat to be judged on rider. Additional testing may apply in the medal class. (USEF Tests 1-8.) Points kept on rider (not horse/rider combination). Overall points will go toward Overall Equitation Rider and Overall Medal Rider.

NOVICE HUNTER AND EQUITATION

This division is limited to horses/ponies or riders who have not shown at or above 2' for more than two years at an organized show. Horse/rider combination may show in this division for two years. Over fence classes will consist of up to eight fences to be jumped at 2'. There will be no oxers in this division. Simple changes are allowed. Additional testing may apply in the medal. (USEF Tests 1-8.) Exhibitors may cross enter into green horse/pony, pony pleasure, pleasure, warm-ups, tadpole jumpers, froggy jumpers and main hunter ring flat and under saddle classes. Year-end points will be kept for the rider (not horse/rider combination).

PLEASURE

Open to any horse or pony/ rider combinations, including professionals. Division will include three classes including pleasure, hunter under saddle and hunter hack. Riders will be asked to show at the walk, trot, and canter both directions. May also be asked to halt or ride on a loose rein etc. Hunter hack class will consist of under saddle phase and to jump one line at 2'. Judged on suitability, way of going, and

soundness. May cross enter into any other classes that rider qualifies for except leadline, walk-trot 10 and under, open walk-trot, beginning crossrail and junior/adult beginning crossrail. Overall points will go toward whichever category the rider is accruing points.

SCHOOLING HUNTER

(OPEN CARD)

Open to any horse/rider combination, including professionals. May cross enter into any other classes/divisions in which they are eligible. The cards for this division will remain open with the under saddle going in the morning. Will be shown in three separate sections (2'3", 2'6", 2'9") with the 2'3" competitors showing during the **Low Hunter** or **Modified Equitation** Division, 2'6" exhibitors doing their courses during the **Child/Adult** Divisions and the 2'9" riders showing during the 2'9" section of the **Junior/Adult Divisions**. All sections will be judged together. Classes will be judged on suitability, manners, soundness, and way of going. Points will be accumulated for the year based on horse/ rider combination. Exhibitors can cross enter into any other classes/divisions in which they are eligible.

LOW HUNTER

To be shown at 2'3" and will include up to 10 obstacles; including walls, oxers, bending lines and occasionally combinations. To be judged on manners, way of going and soundness. Horse/rider combination may have never shown above 2'6", and are limited to two years in this division. No professionals. Points will be accumulated for the year for the horse. Horse/ Rider combinations may only cross enter into warm-ups, pony pleasure, pleasure, schooling hunter, pony hunter, and modified equitation. Eligible for jumper divisions which rider and/or horse qualifies.

MODIFIED EQUITATION

To be shown at 2'3' and will include up to 10 obstacles including walls, bending lines, rollbacks and occasionally combinations. Year-end points will be kept for the rider (not horse/rider combination). Judged on the rider. Additional testing may apply in medal class. (USEF Tests 1-19). Rider may cross enter into warm-ups, pleasure, pony pleasure, schooling hunter, pony hunter, and low hunter. No Professionals. Eligible for jumper divisions which rider and/or horse qualifies.

PONY HUNTER

Over fence classes will be shown in two sections (23" and 2'6') but will be judged together. Course may include up to 10 fences including walls, bending lines and occasionally combinations. To be judged on manners, way of going, and soundness. Points will be accumulated for the year for the pony. May cross enter into any other classes/divisions in which they are eligible. Overall points will go toward Overall Hunter Rider and Overall Hunter Horse/Pony. No professionals.

PONY PLEASURE

Open to any pony/ rider combinations. Riders will be asked to show at the walk, trot, and canter both directions. May also be asked to halt or ride on a loose rein etc. Judged on suitability, way of going, and soundness. Overall points will go toward whichever category the rider is accruing points. May cross enter into any other classes that rider qualifies for except leadline, walk-trot 10 and under, open walk-trot, beginning crossrail, and junior/adult beginning crossrail.

CHILD/ADULT HUNTER

To be shown at 2'6". Course will include up to 10 fences including walls, bending lines and occasionally combinations. To be judged on manners, way of going, and soundness. Points will be accumulated for the year for the horse. May cross enter into warm ups, child/adult equitation, schooling hunter, pleasure, pony pleasure, pony hunter and open hunter. Eligible for jumper divisions which rider and/or horse qualifies. No professionals.

CHILD/ADULT EQUITATION

Over fence classes to be a course of up to 10 fences shown at 2'6". Judged on the rider. Additional testing may apply in medal class. (USEF Tests 1-19). Year-end points will be kept for the rider (not horse/rider combination). No professionals. May cross enter into warm ups, child/adult hunter, schooling hunter, pleasure, pony hunter, pony pleasure, and open hunter. Eligible for jumper divisions which rider and/or horse qualifies. No professionals.

HANDY HUNTER

To be shown at 2'6". Course will include up to 10 fences including walls, bending lines and occasionally combinations and may include rollbacks, and trot or gallop fences. To be judged on horse's ease of maneuvering the course. Points will be accumulated for the year for the horse. May cross enter into any other divisions that rider/horse meet the qualifications.

BIT O' STRAW HUNTER Round 2

The Rider must be a League Member in order for points to count. Any horse shown by a Member Rider will earn points in the division. Rider Membership must be received in the League Office within 10 days after the completion of a League show in order for points from that show to count. Points will not be retroactive. Bit O' Straw Hunter Classic (2'6") Open to Junior or Amateur riders. Eligibility for Children's and Adult Hunters will be determined by show management.

JUNIOR/ADULT HUNTER

Over fence classes will be shown in two sections (2'9" and 3') but will be judged together. Course will include up to 10 fences including walls, bending lines and occasionally combinations. To be judged on manners, way of going, and soundness. Points will be accumulated for the year for the horse. May cross enter into warm

ups, junior/adult equitation, schooling hunter, pleasure, pony pleasure, pony hunter or open hunter. Eligible for jumper divisions which rider and/or horse qualifies. No professionals.

JUNIOR/ADULT EQUITATION

Over fence classes to be a course of up to 10 fences with a 2'9" and 3' section. Judged on the rider. Additional testing may apply in medal class. (USEF Tests 1-19). Year-end points will be kept for the rider (not horse/rider combination). May cross enter into warm ups, junior/adult hunter, schooling hunter, pleasure, pony hunter and open hunter. No professionals.

OPEN HUNTER

Open to all riders and all horses/ponies (including professionals). Courses will include up to 10 fences at a height of 3'3". Horses will be judged on manners, way of going and soundness. Points will be accumulated for the year for the horse. May cross enter into any other division eligible.

OPEN EQUITATION

Over fence classes to be a course of up to 10 fences shown at 3'3". Judged on the rider. Additional testing may apply in medal class. (USEF Tests 1-19). Year-end points will be kept for the rider (not horse/rider combination). May cross enter into any other division eligible.

Jumper Divisions

TADPOLE JUMPER

Open to riders in their first year of showing in jumper classes. Rider may not have shown over 2' at an organized show. Course will include up to 14 jumps of 12" crossrails. Tables may be different at each show but will include 2a, 2b, 2c, 2.1 and gambler's choice. May cross enter in Froggy Jumper. Professionals or advanced riders may show unjudged.

FROGGY JUMPER

Open to riders in their first or second year of showing in jumper classes. Rider may not have shown over 2'3" at an organized show. Course will include up to 14 jumps of 18". Tables may be different at each show but will include 2a, 2b, 2c, 2.1 and gambler's choice. May cross enter into Tadpole Jumper or Novice Jumper but not both. Professionals or advanced riders may show unjudged.

NOVICE JUMPER

Open to riders that have not shown more than two years in jumper classes at or above 2'. Rider may not have shown over 2'6" at an organized show. Course will include up to 14 jumps at 2'. Tables may be different at each show but will include 2a, 2b, 2c, 2.1 and gambler's choice. May cross enter in Froggy Jumper or Beginning

Jumper but not both. No professionals or advanced riders permitted unless unjudged.

BEGINNING JUMPER

Open to riders that have not shown more than two years in jumper classes at or above 2'3". Rider may not have shown over 2'9" at an organized show. Course will include up to 14 jumps at 2' - 2'3". Tables may be different at each show but will include 2a, 2b, 2c, 2.1 and gambler's choice. May cross enter in Novice Jumper and Hopeful Jumper but not both. No professionals or advanced riders permitted unless unjudged.

HOPEFUL JUMPER

Open to riders that have not shown more than two years in jumper classes at 2'6". Course will include up to 14 jumps at 2'6" - 2'9". Tables may be different at each show but will include 2a, 2b, 2c, 2.1 and gambler's choice. May cross enter in Hopeful Jumper and Training Jumper but not both. No professionals or advanced riders permitted.

TRAINING JUMPER

Open to all horse/rider combinations. Course will include up to 14 jumps at 3'. Tables may be different at each show but will include 2a, 2b, 2c, 2.1 and gambler's choice. May cross enter in Hopeful and Low Schooling Jumper but not both.

LOW SCHOOLING JUMPER

Open to all horse/rider combinations. Course will include up to 14 jumps at 3'3" - 3'6". Tables may be different at each show but will include 2a, 2b, 2c, 2.1 and gambler's choice. May cross enter in Training and High Schooling Jumper but not both.

HIGH SCHOOLING JUMPER

Open to all horse/rider combinations. Course will include up to 14 jumps at 4'. Tables may be different at each show but will include 2a, 2b, 2c, 2.1 and gambler's choice. May cross enter into Low Schooling Jumper.

SCHOOLING JUMPER

Open to green horses or ponies. Heights may vary and will be judged together. A novice rider may show a green horse. Rider may cross enter into another division if qualified for. A green horse is less than two years showing in jumper classes.

WARM UP CLASSES

All warm up classes may be shown by any horse/pony or rider officially entered in show. Points will not be counted for daily or year-end awards.

YEAR END AWARDS DIVISION AWARDS

Awards presented in all divisions. Points from all shows will count. However, a rider must show six show days in a division to qualify for a year-end award unless otherwise permitted by management. NOTE: EXHIBITORS MAY REQUEST A ONE TIME EXEMPTION DUE TO SERIOUS INJURY OR ILLNESS (MINIMUM 3 SHOWS) OR SALE OF HORSE. EXHIBITOR MUST SHOW PROOF OF NEED WHEN WRITTEN REQUEST IS PRESENTED. In the event of an exemption, rider may change horses but keep points previously accumulated.

OVERALL BEGINNING RIDER

Awarded to the exhibitor who earned the most points combined throughout the year. Divisions include are Walk-Trot 10 and under, Open Walk- Trot, Leadline, Beginning Crossrail, Junior/Adult Beginning Crossrail, Open Beginning, Short Stirrup and Novice. Any rider competing in the above divisions will also receive points for overall beginning rider for pleasure division.

OVERALL HUNTER RIDER

Awarded to the rider who accumulates the most points in hunter classes (not including walk/trot-novice). Riders may enter as many classes as they like and/or qualify for in class offerings and may show more than one horse. If showing more than one horse/pony, horse/pony may be shown in U/S class with new rider getting points and horse getting points for Overall. Divisions include: Pleasure, Low Hunter, Schooling Hunter, Pony Hunter, Child/Adult Hunter, Handy Hunter, Junior/Adult Hunter and Open Hunter. Open to juniors, adults and professionals.

OVERALL HUNTER HORSE / PONY

Awarded to the horse/pony that accumulates the most points in hunter classes over the show circuit. Horses/ponies may be shown in as many classes with as many riders as qualified in class offerings. If one rider shows more than one horse in over fences classes, another qualifying rider may show U/S with the horse receiving points toward the overall award. Award to be presented to owner. Divisions that qualify are Green Horse & Pony, Pleasure, Hunter Under Saddle, Hunter Hack, Schooling Hunter, Low Hunter, Child/Adult Hunter, Junior/Adult Hunter, Pony Hunter and Open Hunter.

OVERALL EQUITATION RIDER

Awarded to the rider that accumulates the most points in equitation classes over the entire year. May show in more than one equitation division as long as rider meets qualifications specified in class offerings; however, rider will only receive points for highest division shown. Qualifying divisions are Equitation 14 and Under, Modified Equitation, Child/Adult Equitation, Junior/Adult Equitation and Open Equitation.

OVERALL JUMPER RIDER

Awarded to the rider who accumulates the most points in jumper classes throughout the year at any Heritage show. Includes tadpole, froggy, novice, beginning, hopeful, schooling, training, low schooling and high schooling. See class offerings for rider qualifications in divisions. Open to juniors, adults and professionals. Riders may receive points on up to two horses. If a rider is showing three or more horses, they will only get points for only two horses. It will be the two horses receiving the most points.

OVERALL JUMPER HORSE

Awarded to the horse that accumulates the most prize money from any classics or addbacks in any jumper division throughout the year. Open to juniors, adults and professionals.

YEC MEDAL CHALLENGE

Awarded to the exhibitor with the most points accumulated in medal classes throughout the year. All medal classes qualify but rider may only receive points from one medal class per show which will be highest division shown. Open to juniors and adults.

TROPHYLAND BARN CHALLENGE

Awarded to barn that accumulates the most points throughout the year. Each barn will submit a team for Saturday and/or Sunday that consists of three riders. Riders may vary each day or show. Must choose three classes for each rider which they qualify for and are signed up for that day. Challenge is open to all barns and may be entered at any time during the show season. There is no entry fee.

CHALLENGE AND FINALS SHOW

The end of the season show held in June will consist of a regular show on Saturday and special final and trophy classes on Sunday. Points will be awarded for both days of competition on regular point scale unless otherwise stated.

FINALS CLASSES

Finals classes will be open to any exhibitor that qualifies for division as stated in class offerings. No minimum of previous shows required to compete.

CHALLENGE CLASSES

A rider must qualify for challenge classes by showing in a minimum of four show days throughout the season in division. A perpetual trophy will be awarded to the challenge classes winners. The perpetual trophy will be presented at the banquet and must be returned in May of the following year.

EQ - EQUITATION DIVISION© USEF 2017 – Tests 1-19

1. Halt (4 to 6 seconds) or halt and back. When riders working collectively are asked to halt and then back, they must not be penalized if they walk forward a few steps and halt after backing.
2. Hand gallop. A hand gallop may be used on the approach to a jump.
3. Figure eight at trot, demonstrating change of diagonals. At left diagonal, rider should be sitting the saddle when left front leg is on the ground; at right diagonal, rider should be sitting the saddle when right front leg is on the ground; when circling clockwise at a trot, rider should be on left diagonal; when circling counterclockwise, rider should be on the right diagonal.
4. Figure eight at canter on correct lead, demonstrating simple change of lead. This is a change whereby the horse is brought back into a walk or trot (either is acceptable unless the judge specifies) and restarted into a canter on the opposite lead. Figures to be commenced in center of two circles so that one change of lead is shown.
5. Work collectively or individually at a walk, trot and/or canter.
6. Jump low obstacles at a trot as well as at a canter. The maximum height and spread for a trot jump is 3' for horses, 2' for ponies in classes restricted to ponies.
7. Jump obstacles on figure eight course.
8. Question(s) regarding basic horsemanship, tack and equipment and conformation.
9. Ride without stirrups, riders must be allowed option to cross stirrups.
10. Jump low obstacles at a walk as well as at a canter. The maximum height and spread for a walk jump is 2'.
11. Dismount and mount. Individually.
12. Turn on the forehand done through the walk or the halt.
13. Figure eight at canter on correct lead demonstrating flying change of lead.
14. Execute serpentine at a trot and/or canter on correct lead demonstrating simple or flying changes of lead. (SeeEQ112.4 for simple change.)

15. Change leads on a line demonstrating a simple or flying change of lead.
(See EQ112.4 for simple change.)
16. Change horses. (Note: this test is the equivalent of two tests.)
17. Canter on counter lead. (Note: no more than twelve horses may counter canter at one time.) A canter on the counter lead may be used on the approach to a jump.
18. Turn on haunches from the walk.
19. Demonstration ride of approximately one minute. Rider must advise judge beforehand what ride he/she plans to demonstrate.
